Sample Itinerary

DAY 1

After a beautiful drive to Kelowna, relax at Okanagan Lake and explore some of the city's local public art and heritage sites.

DAY 2

Learn from Wise Earth Farm about regenerative agriculture and food systems and hike to Crawford Creek Falls in the afternoon.

DAY 3

Embark on a fun-filled day at Myra Canyon Adventure Park; explore the Myra Canyon Trestles, scenic landscape, and go ziplining and/or tree-top trekking.

DAY 4

Tour one of Okanagan's Regional Parks with a park ranger, try geocaching, and hike Mt. Boucherie, a 60 million year old volcano, to capture incredible views.

DAY 5

Visit the Sncewips Heritage Museum and hear from indigenous leaders from the Westbank First Nation before hopping on the bus back to Vancouver.
