- Lead the facilitation of Insight's local programming through engaging activities and thought-provoking debrief sessions;
- Connect and coordinate with community partners that are supporting program delivery to ensure a positive student/chaperone experience;
- Communicate effectively and foster a positive relationship with the teacher chaperones assigned to your cohort, other facilitators and the High School Programs team leaders;
- Ensure the safety and supervision of students at all times;
- Additional projects that contribute to the success of our local programs as needed.
